What does the Code of Practice say?

The Children and Families Act 2014 says local authorities must provide information, advice and support about special educational needs (SEN), disability, health and social care for children, young people and parents.

The Code of Practice says: 'Local authorities must arrange for children with SEN or disabilities for whom they are responsible, and their parents, and young people with SEN or disabilities for whom they are responsible, to be provided with information and advice about matters relating to their SEN or disabilities, including matters relating to health and social care.'

This means that every local authority should provide a service that is free, easy to access and confidential and that can help children, parents and young people take part in decisions that affect their lives.

What do we offer?

We offer accurate, up-to-date and impartial resources and information about the law on special educational needs and disability. This includes:

- Your rights and choices
- Education, health and social care
- Preparation for and support at meetings
- Building confidence to express your views and concerns
- Work in partnership with schools, the local authority and other professionals to develop positive relationships
- Deal with forms, letters and reports
- Information and training sessions for professionals, parents/carers and young people
- Opportunities to participate through local forums to inform strategic commissioning
- Referral/signposting to other agencies (where appropriate)

- Information to enable you to understand the new legal SEND framework
- Help you work closely with other professionals to get your views heard
